Across all disciplines, you, as a Subject Expert Teacher, have the opportunity to share your passion for teaching and create a powerful learning experience for your students. To qualify for the BASIS.ed J-1 Teacher Program, you must have:

- A degree-equivalent to a U.S. bachelor's degree in either education or the academic subject field in which they intend to teach, Master's degree preferred (Elementary or Early Learning Education for Primary School Learning Expert Teachers)
- Be working as a teacher in the home country or country of legal residence at the time of application, or, if not working as a teacher, otherwise meet the eligibility qualifications and (a) have recently (within 12 months of application) completed an advanced degree and (b) have two years of full-time teaching experience within the past eight years
- Have a minimum of two years (24 months) of teaching or related professional experience
- Meet all necessary qualifications to teach your subject at the designated level (Primary/Elementary, Middle School, High School) in your home country, including any necessary Teaching Certificate or designations
- The ability to successfully pass an extensive criminal check in your home country
- Have a passion for your subject and a passion for teaching
- The ability to connect with young students
- Approval from your home school to participate in the cultural exchange of coming to the United States

FEES AND COSTS FOR BASIS.ed J-1 TEACHER PROGRAM

Applicant's financial responsibility:

- \$150 non-refundable application fee – payable after eligibility has been established by BASIS.ed
- \$200 document evaluation fee through acknowledged evaluation service
- Travel expenses to and from the United States for the spouse and dependents, as well as the travel expenses back home for the teacher
- \$180 SEVIS Fee
- \$160 Visa application fee
- Dependents' and/or spouse's insurance premiums – dependent's insurance premium is \$5.26 per month, spouse's insurance premium is \$8.76 per month
- Personal expense money for the initial costs upon arriving to the U.S., prior to receiving their first paycheck – minimum \$3,000 in cash or credit card
- Certification or licensure costs at U.S. school
- Financial responsibility to provide for dependents

BASIS.ed's financial responsibility:

- Health insurance and evacuation/repatriation costs for the teacher
- Teacher's flight fare one way to the U.S. up to \$1,000 (not for spouse or dependents), to be paid by the school where the teacher has been placed
