Clinical Pharmacy Specialist, Ben Taub Hospital

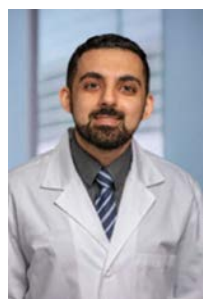

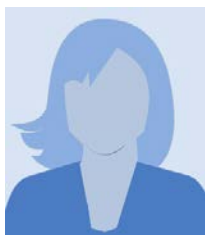
