

## School Coach and District Instructional Specialists

- **School Instructional Coach**-Job-embedded professional development and coaching support for all teachers, which involves curriculum, assessment, and instruction
  - Coaches and mentors individual teachers who request or require assistance with instructional strategies, classroom management, lesson design, accomplishing the objectives established in the school improvement plan or a teacher's individual growth plan, and/or with implementing regular and supplemental curricular, instructional, and assessment programs.
  - Monitors and analyzes all instructional assessment data, assists teachers with utilizing disaggregated student achievement data to plan and deliver instruction, and provides large- and small-group and individual training (or professional development) to help teachers make data-driven instructional decisions. Ensures that targeted students (ELL and remedial) are making adequate academic progress.
  
- **District Instructional Specialist** – Curriculum assessment and coaching support for all teachers across content area
  - Coaches teachers in the planning and implementation of the regular and supplemental curricula utilizing differentiated instructional strategies to meet the needs of all students, designing and implementing classroom management and organizational structures, and utilizing assessments and the resulting data to monitor student progress.
  - Coaches and models for teachers how to utilize disaggregated student achievement data to plan and deliver instruction and make data-driven instructional decisions. Models student monitoring to ensure that targeted students are making adequate academic progress.
